“DARKENU”- the Yeshiva Way!

STRETCH!

“Moses stretched out his hand over the sea”. The question begs itself: In an event of such miraculous nature, why did Hashem need Moshe to stretch out his hand? Surely Moshe’s outstretched arm and staff did not contribute to this historic demonstration of Hashem’s might and control over all the details of our world?

Rav Shteinman learns from here a fundamental truth: Hashem wants human participation. Not only token symbolism, but at ‘full stretch’. Act like it depends on you, knowing full well that the crashing waters crashing, the fury and flame were a revelation that had never been seen – and certainly was not in response to the human hand.



Hashem created a world in which the human being enjoys terrific power. Every nuance is significant. Indeed each gaze and each well-chosen word becomes a source of spiritual moment way beyond what the eye perceives. As a telescope facing even 1 centimetre away from its mark – misses the target by light years.

Great faith spawns grand deeds and responsibility. It means that, with Hashem's will, we are capable of moving mountains of water and of earth. It means at least that we should stretch out our arms as far as they can go to reach for greatness.

As outsiders, it is easier for us to peer through the tears and see the beauty of a modern day Avraham and Sarah in the form of Mrs Bloch's parents who were married for 65 years and who, when Len died Inge just couldn't continue living without him.

I was so impressed by the matric students who represented the Boys' High who stayed behind after the funeral to fill the grave, not leaving until the job was complete. Shkoyach gentlemen!

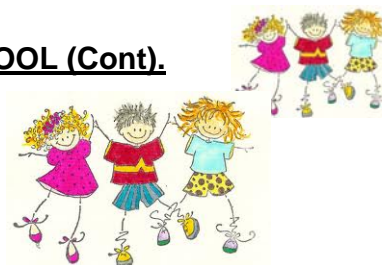
